



Birchwood - Pupil Premium Plan- 2020 - 2021

Pupil Premium is additional funding provided from the Government to help schools close the attainment gap between disadvantaged children and their peers.

The funding is allocated to all schools for children from Reception to Year 11 who meet the criteria as mentioned below:-

Pupils in year groups Reception to Year 11 who have registered for free school meals in the last 6 years (recorded as Ever 6) schools receive £935.00 per pupil.

Looked-after children (LAC) defined in the Children Act 1989 as one who is in the care of, or provided with accommodation by, an English local authority schools receive £2,300 per pupil.

Children who have ceased to be looked after by a local authority in England and Wales because of adoption, a special guardianship order, a child arrangements order or a residence order schools receive £2,300

Service child/children or in receipt of a child pension from the Ministry of Defence, schools receive £300 per pupil.

Unlike other schools we do not directly receive Pupil Premium for all eligible pupils, we have an ongoing agreement with the 'home schools' where we invoice them for these monies for the time that is spent in our provision.

Birchwood commits to ensuring that every child who is entitled to receive this additional funding receives additional support bespoke to their needs during their stay in our school. Birchwood is committed to closing the gap between the progress of pupils who receive the funding and those considered to not be disadvantaged.

Objectives for Pupil Premium in this school:

- These child will be provided with additional educational support to improve progress and raise the standard of achievement for them
- The school will aim to close the gap between the achievement of our pupils and their peers both nationally and within the school
- As far as resources allow, the school will use the additional funding to address any underlying inequalities between pupils eligible for Pupil Premium and others
- We will ensure any additional funding received reaches the pupils who need it the most and that it makes a significant impact on their education and lives.
- Birchwood recognizes that pupil premium who have SEND, and Pupil Premium pupils who
 do not have SEND and children in care, all provision is tailored slightly differently for these
 identified vulnerable groups.

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Conclusions

- Pupil premium students achieved significantly higher GCSE results in Maths and English than non PP pupils.
- Attendance for non PP pupils is only slightly higher than for PP pupils. Attendance as a whole is being tackled using various school strategies. Most pupils had much lower attendance at their home school and arrived at Birchwood with very low attendance and long period on reduced timetables.
- Exclusion figures are much lower for PP pupils.
- There were 0 permanent exclusion for any pupils that attend Birchwood.
- There was only one NEET pupil for Birchwood pupils leaving in July 2021.
